WHITLEY COUNTY EDC

MICROLOAN FUND

The Microloan Fund provides working capital for businesses in Whitley County. Recipients must be either currently or formerly engaged with the Whitley County EDC's Small Business Entrepreneurship Initiative (SBEI) program.

• The maximum loan amount is \$10,000

WHITLEY COUNTY EDC

COMMUNITY AND SMALL BUSINESS LOAN FUND

The Community and Small Business Fund provides loans for working capital, equipment, building improvements (if no other RLF program is available), and matching funds for façade grant improvements.

• The maximum loan amount is \$25,000

WHITLEY COUNTY EDC

GROWTH VENTURE LOAN FUND

The Growth Venture Fund is primarily designed as a business incentive program and can be used for any growth or start-up related expense excluding payroll/salaries.

• The maximum loan amount is \$100,000

COLUMBIA CITY REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (RDC)

COLUMBIA CITY REVOLVING LOAN FUND PROGRAM

- 1. Promotes the physical revitalization and strengthen the economic viability of the downtown Columbia City TIF District by providing financial incentives for improving the appearance and structural conditions of downtown buildings through low-interest loans;
- 2. Stimulate private sector investment in downtown;
- 3. Address issues that improve the economic viability of the downtown district.
- The minimum loan amount is \$10,000.
- The maximum loan amount is \$50,000.

COLUMBIA CITY REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (RDC)

FACADE IMPROVEMENT MATCHING GRANT

Façade Improvement Matching Grant Program stimulates efforts to improve the street appearance of Columbia City's commercial and business facades. All grants awarded require a matching dollar-for- dollar expenditure by the owner or tenant. Open May 31-August 31

• The maximum grant amount is \$3,000.

INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FEDERAL REHABILITATION INVESTMENT TAX CREDIT (RITC)

The Federal Historic Preservation Tax Incentives program encourages private sector investment in the rehabilitation and re-use of historic buildings. The RITC is a program administered by the National Park Service and provides a 20% credit on qualified expenses toward the owners federal income taxes.

- The minimum project amount \$10,000
- The maximum project amount is \$250,000
